Re: Report

As previously noted, MMEA needs to be much more aware of the ramifications of legislation on education in general, and music education specifically. MMEA also needs to more closely monitor potential actions of the State Board of Education and D.E.S.E.

I would suggest all MMEA members, especially BOD/AC members, contact their 'local' state representative and senator to establish a line of communication. The ability to connect with one of these office holders is vital. These are the people who make laws regarding teacher tenure, graduation requirements, charter schools, achievement testing, retirement funds, etc.

Further, I would suggest more timely updates be sent via the mass e-mail system to inform all MMEA members of pending legislation, committee meetings, hearings, etc. Everyone needs to realize that timing is vital when contacting legislators.

The single most effective method of contacting legislators, committee members, and other office holders is email. Sending an e-mail is not time-consuming for the sender. E-mails are read [and counted] by either the legislator or a staffer.

The attempt to override the Governor's veto of SB253 may take place in the September Veto Session. Among other things, this would reduce corporate taxes, and add taxes to sales of prescription drugs. Enactment of SB253 would negatively impact education funding in Missouri.

Again, I would recommend MMEA hire a lobbyist whose responsibility would be to audit State Board of Education meetings, monitor Department of Elementary and Secondary Education meetings, and follow education-related bills through the committee process.

The State Editor's meeting was held during the NAfME Music Education Week activities in Tyson's Corner, VA. It provided welcome information from other editors from across the country. Topics by Bill Froom, Illinois state editor, included InDesign operations and shortcuts, Photoshop tricks, and useful layout information. Ella Wilcox, editor of *MEJ* and *Teaching Music* presented tips for successful writers. Troy Johnson, Kansas MEA Webmaster talked about on-line publishing, and Abi Young, Pennsylvania MEA state editor, shared her experiences using Guidebook for conference programs. Networking with editors around the country provided a forum for questioning and sharing successes and failures. The subject of obtaining parental permission to use photos of minor children in publications was also discussed.

Thank you for submitting articles in a timely manner. The depth of content in MSM continues to improve. This is due to your continued efforts to write articles designed to increase the awareness of the importance of music education throughout Missouri, and to provide help and guide teachers in your area.

Now that you are a published author, remember that clear and concise communication is appealing to MSM readers. A suggested website for answers to your questions about grammar and syntax: <a href="http://www.quickanddirtytips.com/grammar-girl">http://www.quickanddirtytips.com/grammar-girl</a>.

Microsoft Word has a limited grammar check available as you write. If there is a green wavy line below the text, double click (PC) or Control click (MAC) on that portion for suggestions.

Common mistakes in English written communication:

- Avoid using the passive tense. Write, "I will sing" rather than "I will be singing."
- Avoid capitalizing words that are not titles. Even though words such as band, choir, and orchestra are important to you, they are not capitalized unless they are in the title of a specific group, e.g., The Marine Band, or The Mormon Tabernacle Choir, or The Boston Symphony Orchestra.
- A pronoun should agree with its antecedent in gender and number, i.e., rather than "Each student should be aware of their posture," choose "Each student should be aware of his or her posture," or "Students should be aware of their posture."

The next submission deadline for publication in the winter (conference) issue is November 1, 2013. The subject of that magazine is "Improvise!" Teachers and students must "improvise" in more than just instrumental jazz ensembles. Some suggested questions to help you as you write about "improvisation" are, "How do you teach improvisation in the orchestra or choral or general classroom? How do you improvise when budget cuts make material resources scarce? How do you improvise with professionalism when administrators insist on changes in curriculum? How do you improvise with love and grace when your colleagues challenge your program? How do you improvise your lesson plans when students' needs overshadow your class preparation?" These suggestions are merely guidelines to help you write an article. You are not limited to this theme or the prior questions. Please use your own creative ideas and the topics that inspire you.

Remember that MMEA is more than the conference. While it is important to let your readers know what is in store at meetings this year, please consider that information regarding the event should be limited to one issue. We ask that you refrain from writing about what is coming up in the December issue, and then writing about how wonderful the conference was in the February issue. Once is clearly enough. Also, please be aware that the performing groups are published in the September issue, and the schedule of concerts and clinics will appear in the December issue. Listing these events in your article is redundant, although some writers may choose to elaborate about workshop session content.

Thank you for a great kickoff to the 2013-2014 school year. Current board members are reminded that your last article for MSM is due February 1, 2014. This is a mere 6 days after you return home from the 2014 conference!

An MSM editorial advisory committee will hold a one-time meeting on Saturday, September 7, 2013 in Columbia. Topics of discussion will include online software and cost constraints, layout and style, and the preparation of a survey instrument for the MMEA membership.

#### **Conference Clinics**:

A huge concern has been the cost of activating a Tri-M Chapter. It was \$100, regardless school / chapter size. Thanks to Patrick Barnett (National Tri-M Chair), a new fee schedule has been approved. There are 4 levels based on school size (i.e. size of the high school for high school chapters, size of the middle school / jr. high for those chapters):

Level A (less than 500).....\$50 Level B (500-999).....\$75 Level C (1,000-1,999).....\$100 Level D (2,000 and up).....\$125

Chapter activation runs from June-June. No matter what date a chapter is activated, it will only remain active until the following June 30<sup>th</sup> (e.g. a chapter activated on May 1, 2014 will be up for renewal on June 30, 2014).

The Tri-M Manual is currently undergoing updates and revisions.
